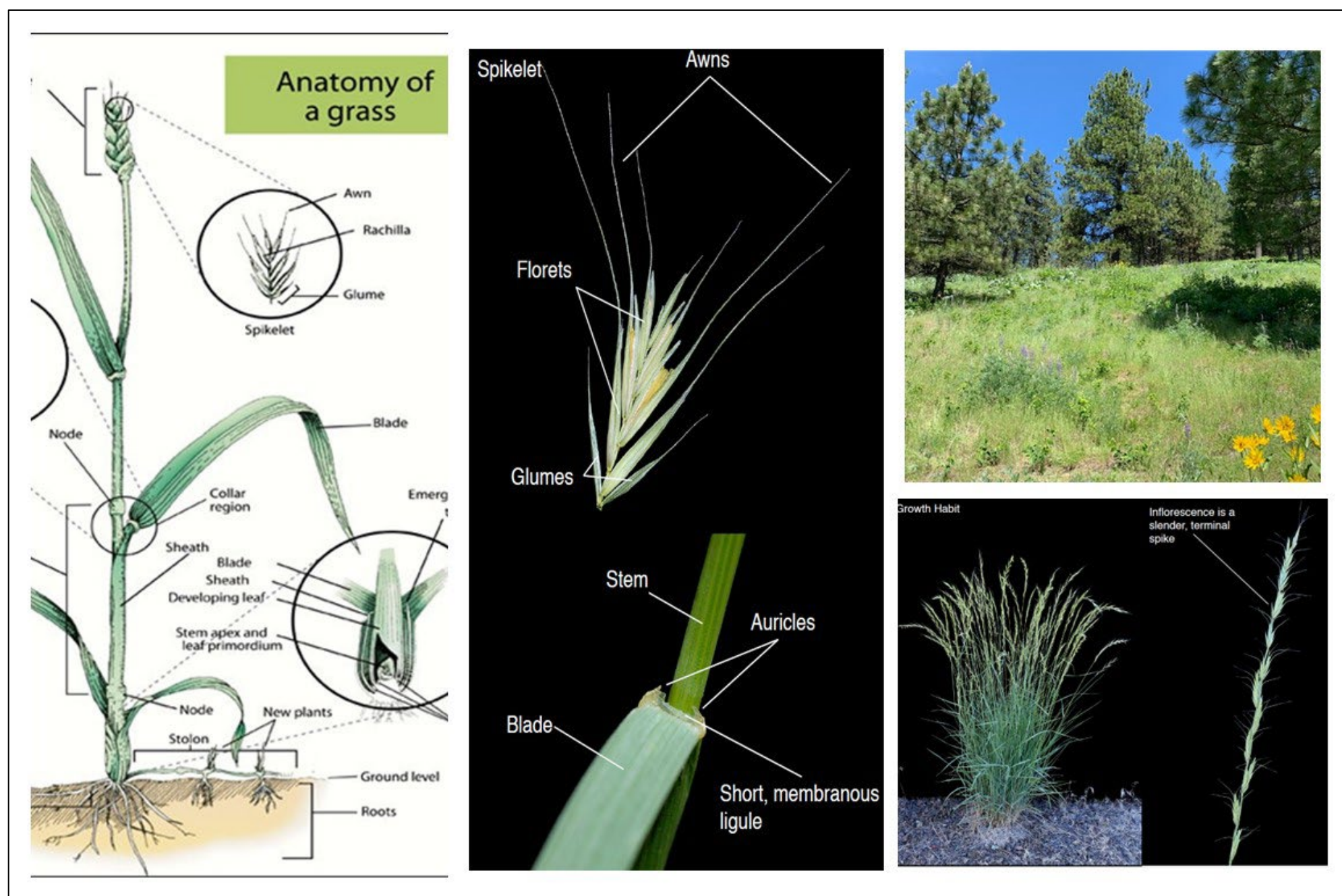

**Workshop:** In a classroom session, you will learn grass taxonomy and morphology, how to use a dichotomous key, and how to identify grasses common on the Palouse. The following day, we will go on a field trip to Tom Besser and Kathy Potter's place and to the Phillips Farm (both within 5 miles of Moscow) to see and identify grasses in their natural environment. Bring a hand lens and grasses you would like help identifying. We will use the *Field Guide to Grasses and Grasslike Plants of Idaho* and the associated phone app (available for iPhone and Android). The workshop is **limited to 20 participants**, with priority to current Idaho Native Plant Society (INPS) and Palouse Prairie Foundation (PPF) members. Register early before the workshop fills up!
